To provide surge support to selected FCS country teams

To design and facilitate changes in Bank policy and practice to improve results in FCS

To help address the volatility of financing for FCS

To overcome isolation of FCS practitioners by connecting them together to share experience.

To facilitate new partnerships with institutions in critical areas affecting security, justice and jobs.

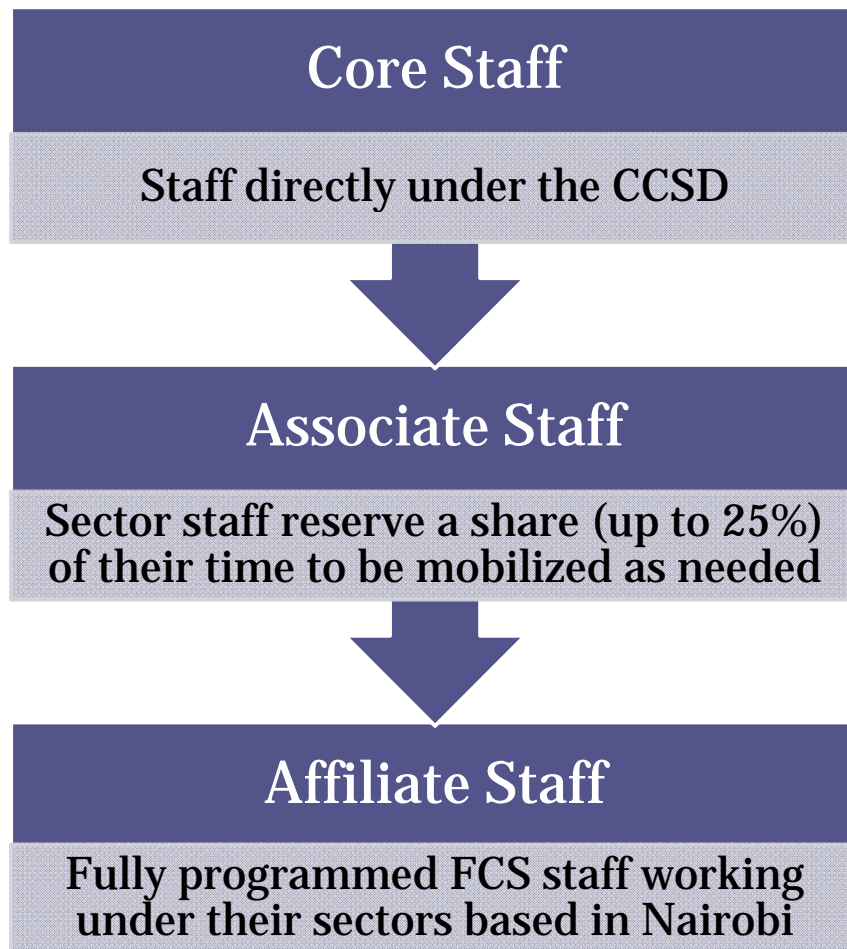

# Who Will Work in the CCSD?



- All staff will have MoUs between CCSD and sectors.
- CCSD to manage FCS global community of practice to encourage flexible mobilization across regions
- Heavy emphasis on STAs, DAISes, other flex assignments
- CCSD will also maintain roster of secondments, consultants and donors partners

# Main Challenges → Suggested Actions

Mobilization of staff  
slow

- Action: Re-confirm sector commitments for affiliate and associate staff positions.

Difficult to establish  
“Center of  
Excellence” buzz

- Action: MD announcement of CCSD staff recruitment and special designation of positions.

FCS ops framework:  
exceptional or  
integrated?

- Action: Clarify the desirability of a specialized implementation framework for FCS operations.

More flexible  
financing to respond  
to FCS volatility

- Action: Seek Board approval for greater flexibility in the use of the State & Peace-building Fund.
